I pledge to fully support the above anti-bullying statement adopted by New England Region United Synagogue Youth and also agree to be an advocate for those subject to bullying. I assert that bullying is unacceptable, and therefore pledge to stand up for and support all victims. Furthermore, I pledge to never use words meant to be derogatory or hurtful, especially in the context of sexuality, race, handicap, and appearance. I will not tolerate derogatory speech and cruel actions.
