Shofar- If you have a shofar and want to bring it and help us blow shofar, please do! We will be blowing shofar during the month of Elul to usher in the Jewish holidays.

DRESS CODE: As per the national dress code

- No tank tops (wide band sleeveless shirt are OK), halter tops, bare midriffs, 2 piece bathing suits (tankinis are OK), clothing which shows your underwear, or clothing with profanity or inappropriate language/symbols on it are allowed at any time throughout the week.
